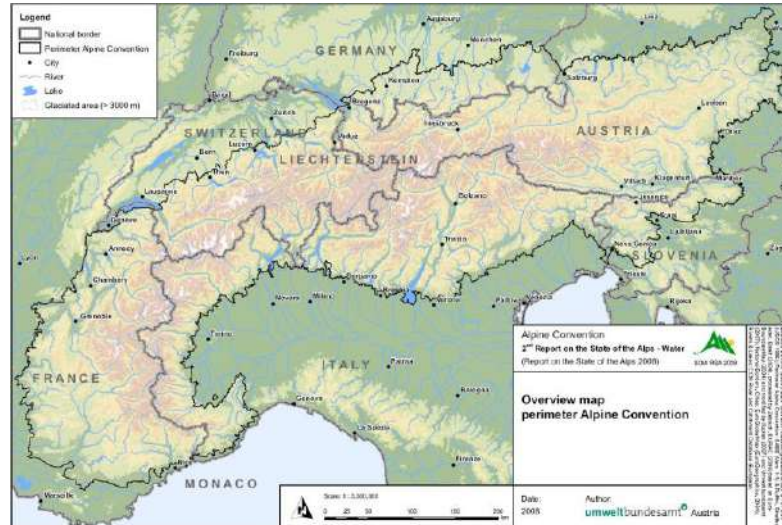
A pioneer of its kind: The first international treaty covering an entire mountain range that crosses several national borders.

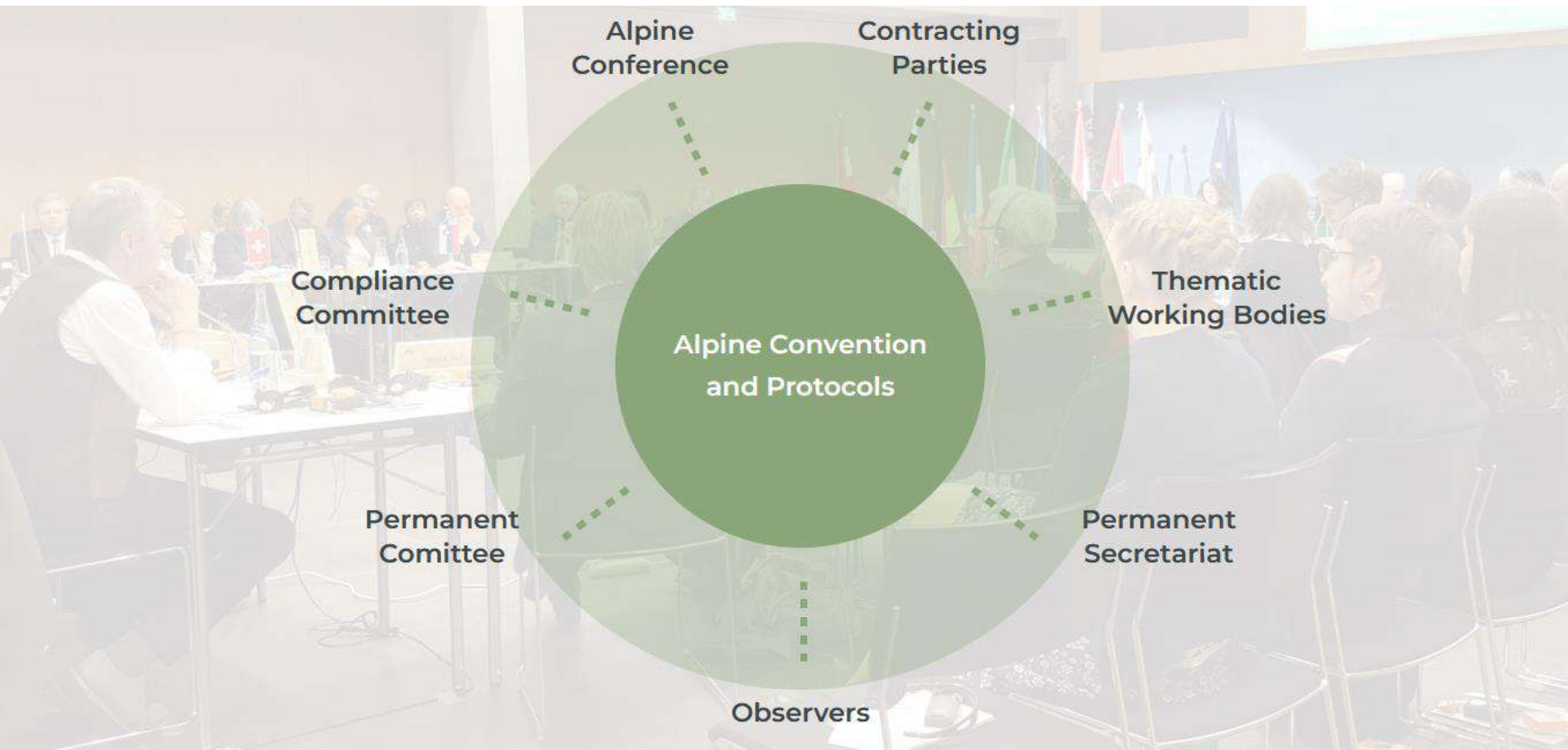

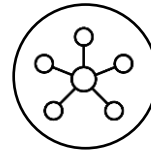
